### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

## **Dual Credit Committee Report:** (Patrick Gordon)

A full-time, dual credit program on ECC's campus is scheduled begin in the Fall Semester of 2016. The program, called "Accelerate College," will draw a maximum of 30 high school students from each of two community unit school districts: District 300 and District 303. Therefore, a maximum of 60 total students will be enrolled in the program. The deadline for the students to enroll is April 15, 2016.

In general, students in the Accelerate College program will be on campus on Monday through Thursday during the day, and most classes and labs for these students are expected to be scheduled during those times. When it is not possible to accommodate these students with Monday through Thursday classes/labs, some flexibility exists to schedule Friday classes/labs for them.

The Accelerate College students will have access to ECC advisors. A decision has not yet been made as to whether a specific advisor(s) will be assigned to them. The students may also have access to counseling services through their high school. Any faculty member who wishes to discuss or address an issue regarding a specific Accelerate College student may contact the Associate Dean of College Readiness and School Partnerships.
