Rationale:

ECCFA and SSECCA would like to join forces to offer our students special funding in order to do important work in the school community and greater Elgin community by offering a \$1,000.00 scholarship to one Student Life approved club or group (or a cooperative of clubs who have joined together to pursue this opportunity).

Clubs that would like to be considered for the benefit will submit a proposal using the attached proposal form. Resolution #34 Urge Jesse White to Seek Re-election as Secretary of State

WHEREAS, Jesse White is a proud member of Chicago Teachers Union Local 1 AFT/IFT; and

WHEREAS, Prior to being an elected official, Jesse White served his country as a member of the 101st Airborne Division and as a member of the Illinois National Guard, and WHEREAS, Jesse White served the people of Chicago as an educator, a coach and an administer in the Chicago Public School System, and WHEREAS, in 1959, Jesse White founded the renowned Jesse White Tumblers who have entertained generations of people, and WHEREAS, State Jesse White began his career in public service as member of the Illinois House of Representatives in 1974; and WHEREAS, In the Illinois House of Representatives he accrued a 98 per cent Labor voting record, and WHEREAS, Jesse White was elected Cook County Recorder of Deeds in 1992 and re-elected in 1996; and WHEREAS, Jesse White was elected Illinois Secretary of State in 1998 with 56 per cent of the vote, won re-election in 2002 with 68% of the vote, won re-election in 2006 with 63% of the vote, won re-election in 2010 with 70% of the vote and won re-election in 2014 with 66% of the vote; and WHEREAS, During his tenure as Secretary of State, Jesse White has cracked down on Driving Under the Influence (DUI), enacted teen driving safety programs, worked to improve truck safety and improved customer service in driver's license facilities; and WHEREAS, In 2018 the office of Illinois Secretary of State will be up for election; and WHEREAS. Over the course of his lifetime, Jesse White has served the people of Illinois with integrity and honor as a true statesman; therefore be it RESOLVED, that the Illinois AFL-CIO strongly urges Jesse White to seek re-election as Illinois Secretary of State in 2018, and be it further RESOLVED, that the Illinois AFL-CIO urges other unions and organizations to adopt similar resolutions and statements urging Jesse White to seek re-election as Secretary of State in 2018.
