Introductions

The conversation meandered, primarily "get to know us, and him."

Larry taught at CC in Minneapolis x 14 years, state CC faculty president x 8 years, he organized college of education for state university; he was president of a college; he stepped down in 2011 and has since been AtD coach; we are his 4^{th} college.

How many of us took the ICAT? He explained the survey is an attempt to classify; identify areas to make progress; equity is emerging on everyone's plan, this includes poverty. Students are economically impoverished. Students are not very forthcoming about this, however, may qualify for financial aid. Institutions struggle regarding what to do about it. At the national AtD meeting, $\sim 25\%$ of sessions addressed this topic, poverty. His experiences- bring the county to the campus and were amazed to find large cross section of students were already being served. Housing vouchers, food, transportation. Look at intersection of ethnic diversity and poverty; student focus groups. Google map for a student to the degree, plan the route... resulted in 19% increase in retention fall to fall. The tool is an instrument to serve as a prompt. Identify folks who are willing to act.

ECC- very little gap between low and high scores on the survey. Teaching & Learning and Data & Technology. There is a "don't know" response option. Grants- writing across the curriculum, etc... focus on improving teaching. Our comments: It would be useful to be able to take survey on opening day. Some institutions are looking at targeting specific areas of the survey. What is status of higher education in Illinois? We are participating in Teach Out in Springfield. Impact on students access to health & social services, and not being able to get medications. Stories matter and have impact... eg. math student goes cold turkey on psychiatric medications. What are you proud of... students, innovation, professional development, faculty?

Safe zone and veterans training, Faculty Research committee; CETL may be coming back; (Larry chaired a professional development group), American Council on Education (Tom Angelo, Pat Cross) 25 module online program, the association of college and university educators... it has categories and modules... Carol Dweck, Mindset (book) one of the modules summarizes her research. Big fans of 5 minute rites; start with muddy point, take question, central question, write for 5 minutes, talk 6-7 minutes, this 5 rite class transformed his teaching. He is talking about ACUE.org; Teaching Circles

Faculty learning community- created community; small stipends for conducting some research. We did have Great Teacher's Seminar.
